What do we mean by ethics?


- A group of moral principles or set of values that define or direct us to the right choice

- Pensions Act requirements
 - S59A fit and proper person
 - Investment qualifications
 - Trustee training



- Pensions Authority minimum standards
 - Know more than members
 - Time and commitment
 - Ask the right questions



Trustee governance

Trustees should:

- hold regular meetings
- consider conflicts of interest
- take advice where necessary
- be familiar with scheme provisions
