DC Codes of Governance

- Consultation outcome
- Objective is best outcome for members
- Inform actions in area of governance
 - Governance framework
 - Risk management
 - Conflicts of interest
 - Paying benefits
 - Keeping records
 - Communicating costs and Value for money
- Revisions in train
- Voluntary in nature with incremental publication from January 2016



Trustee Qualifications

- Consultation outcome
- Minimum relevant qualification
- Meetings with educational providers
- Consultation paper with responses due by 1 October
- 30 submissions analysed – synopsis published
- More work to be done



Model Disclosure Documents

- Consultation outcome
- Need for more simplified information
- Working group established
- 7 model documents produced to date
- Disclosure regulations need to be reviewed



DB Governance

- DB Financial Management Guidelines
- DB engagement



Scheme Data

- Concerns about integrity of data being submitted
- Main issues – trustee details, scheme details and ASI returns
- Data Analysis activity by the Authority
